The ten words

Deuteronomy 4:41 - 6:3



The story so far...

Moses was instructed to teach God's redeemed people to listen to His word and to follow Him faithfully so that it will go well with them as they live in the land. Painful lessons from the past ought to dissuade them from disobeying God's word. And living according to God's word will make their lifestyle attractive to the other nations; for who has such an immense privilege of having their God near them, like they do? They were warned sternly that it is easy to forget the LORD or to be unfaithful by worshipping idols - the idols of the nations that they're going to defeat. But by abandoning the exclusive worship of the LORD their God will incur devastating consequences; they'll be exiled from the land to live in a land where the inhabitants worship idols. Yet there is a way back: for if they seek the LORD wholeheartedly, they will find Him; and He will restore them to the land. Finally, by looking back over their history, they'll conclude that there is only one God.

God spoke these words...

Once again Moses instructs the Israelites in God's word; this is really important as he will not cross over to enter the promised land with them so they need to hear God's word afresh (4:41-49).
